For the Shabbos Table

"Veharbah arbeh es zaracha kekochvei hashamayim vekachol asher al sefas hayam"

"And I will increase your offspring like the stars of the heavens and the sand of the seashore" (Bereishis 22:17)

We find that Klal Yisrael is compared to

three things: sand of the seashore, dust of the earth, and the stars in the sky (see Bereishis 28:14). What is the significance of these three comparisons?

Rav Moshe Feinstein zt"l explains as follows. The land is protected from being flooded by ocean waters by the sand barrier at the shoreline. Klal Yisrael as well has the inborn ability to persevere and withstand waves of trials and tribulations.

The dust of the earth, explains Rav Moshe, has no innate purpose other than being the foundation of agriculture. A person must realize that he wasn't created to serve his personal desires, but rather to do for others and fulfill his Creator's will.

The comparison to the stars symbolize the ability for each and every Jew to rise and shine independently and individually. We are all invested with strengths and capabilities to accomplish in our own lives and shine like a luminary in Hashem's eyes.

In a similar vein, Rav Shlomo Freifeld zt"l explains that we are compared to the stars based on that which it says in Tehillim (147:4): There are countless stars and they each have a name. Klal Yisrael as well are all part of a great nation, yet at the same time, each one of us has a "name," and our unique significance and importance which can't be attained by anyone else.
